

# T-LEVELS

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

Technical Levels, also known as 'T-Levels', are new two year programmes designed with employers to ensure young people get the skills industries need.

CRC is delivering T-Levels in Education & Childcare and Construction & the Built Environment.

A new technical alternative to A-Levels, T-Levels are designed to help young people gain skilled jobs.

T-Levels will include:

- Technical knowledge and practical skills specific to your chosen industry or occupation.
- An industry placement of at least 45 days in your chosen industry or occupation.
- Relevant maths, English and digital skills.
- Valuable workplace skills.



## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

### FULL-TIME COURSES

#### ENTRY LEVEL

These courses will help you build up skills, experience and gain confidence to progress to Level 1. No formal qualifications are needed.

#### LEVEL 1 - FOUNDATION LEVEL

You must have achieved an appropriate Entry Level vocational qualification and/or two GCSEs at grade 2 (E) or above.

#### LEVEL 2 - INTERMEDIATE LEVEL

You must have achieved an appropriate Level 1 vocational qualification and/or three GCSEs at grade 3 (D) or above (including English or maths), or equivalent experience. On some courses entry will be dependent on vocational experience and may require specific subjects.

#### LEVEL 3 - ADVANCED LEVEL

You must have achieved an appropriate Level 2 vocational qualification and/or four GCSEs at grade 9-4 (A\*-C), including maths and/or English; or equivalent industry experience. On some courses specific subjects may be required.

#### LEVEL 4/5 - HIGHER EDUCATION

You must have achieved an appropriate Level 3 Extended Diploma or other vocational Diplomas, or two A Levels, or Access to Higher Education qualification or an Art Foundation or University Foundation Programme.

### T-LEVELS

T-Levels typically require 4-5 GCSE's at Grade 4 or above including English Language and maths. Specific pathways may require further GCSE grades in some subjects.

# TRAVELLING TO COLLEGE

CRC is one of the easiest colleges to get to. There are discounted train and bus tickets for students and we run a FREE shuttle bus to and from the local stations to our campuses. Choose the college buses, use public transport or travel by car, bike or foot.

Students who attend CRC qualify for discounted season tickets of up to 50% either through Great Northern Rail or Greater Anglia. Visit our transport section of the website for details of how to apply. Our campuses are within walking distance from nearby stations and we run a free shuttle bus between Cambridge North Railway Station and our Cambridge Campus, as well as a free shuttle bus from Huntingdon bus station to our Huntingdon Campus.

## PUBLIC BUSES

The college campuses are served by many public bus routes. Students can often get discounts, such as 50% off on Stagecoach buses. Always check for the latest bus routes and see the providers' websites for discounts.

The Guided Busway runs between both campuses with stops next to our campuses. The College has two stops on the Guided Busway in Cambridge: 'Science Park/Cambridge Regional College' and 'Orchard Park East' (Route A & B). For Huntingdon Campus, the Guided Busway (Route B) stops at 'Huntingdon Campus'.

## CARS

We have plenty of designated parking spaces for students at each campus. Parking is free at the Huntingdon Campus, with a £2 per visit parking charge at the Cambridge Campus.

## CYCLING

We actively encourage our students and staff to choose a green method of transport when travelling to college. We have plenty of cycle racks available including covered spaces. Students aged under 19 may be able to claim a cycling allowance from Cambridgeshire County Council.

## COLLEGE BUSES

Our buses travel from Cambridgeshire, Essex, Hertfordshire and Suffolk to pick up students. Operating during term-time, the buses are timed to arrive prior to 9:00am, Cambridge Campus, and 9:15am, Huntingdon Campus, and depart at 4:20pm, Cambridge Campus, and 4:25pm, Huntingdon Campus. Our bus pass charges, for college buses only, are available online.





# HOW TO APPLY

## 1 Apply

You can apply for a course with us at any time, but the sooner you apply the sooner we can secure your place. If you attend a school which uses the MyChoice@16 application portal then your careers teacher will advise you on how to apply. If your school does not use this portal or if you are a mature student, you can apply online on our college website by finding your course and clicking apply.

On receipt of your application, we will invite you to a Welcome Event and you will have a 1-to-1 guidance call for your chosen course.

## 2 Reserve your place

On application you will receive an offer of a place subject to achieving the required grades and entry criteria\*. You will be asked to attend a Welcome Event where we will provide you with more information about your chosen course and offer you a place if suitable.

Accept the offer to confirm your place.

### \*EHCPs

If you have an Education Health and Care plan we will work closely with your Local Authority to ensure that you have an effective transition to college and our offer of a place is conditional on when the consultation is complete and approved.

## 3 Orientation Days

New Student Orientation Days are typically scheduled for the first week of July. They give you the opportunity to participate in taster activities related to your course and meet other people who will be studying with you from September.

## 4 GCSE Results Day

Whether you do better than expected, or not as well as you'd hoped, get in touch and let us know or visit our Advice Cafés that take place from GCSE Results Day onwards to discuss your options. Whatever the outcome we will work with you to ensure your career stays on track.

## 5 Enrol

You will be invited to enrol with the college, subject to meeting the entry requirements. Make sure to have your results to hand! You will be given all the details about your first day once you have enrolled.
