Mnemonics

A mnemonic is a memorable phrase in which the first letter of each word is the first letter of something you want to remember. Mnemonics often create a memorable image too. E.g. King Philip Came Over From Great Spain

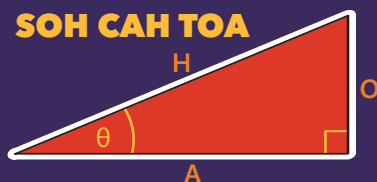


Acronyms

Abbreviate several words into a new, pronounceable word. Acronyms can help you to learn lists of information.

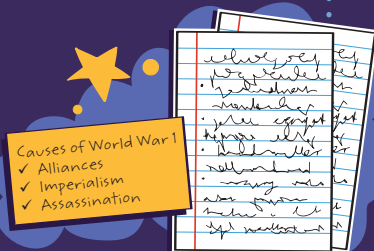

Key words

- Condense your notes into short bullet points.
- Group your bullets into lists, using headings. Revise them in order, so that remembering one point will stimulate your memory of the next.
- If you highlight your notes first, always write down the key words somewhere separately.
