EAST CAMBS SKILLS FAIR

All Year 10 students attended the East Cambs Skills Fair at Ely Cathedral in October 2021. This Skills Fair has been an annual event that all schools in East Cambs can access. Due to the pandemic it was cancelled for two years, but has now returned. Going to the skills fair may be students first opportunities to speak to local employers and see the range of employment sectors there are locally. There were opportunities to speak to a varie-

ty of employers and sixth form providers. Some interactive activities were available that students could take part in as well as picking up information leaflets and pens. Students commented that "they did not realise what the local area had to offer."

This event is so well received that we have booked for the next one during the Autumn Term of 2022.

The application process for Year 11 students started in earnest during November 2021. Sixth Form Providers invited students to book visits at their centres and welcomed them on tours. It gave students the chance to see what the sixth forms were offering and to gauge a feel for the provider. Witchford Village College also offered parents and students an open event on the 23rd September 2021 and invited all providers in as well as some local businesses, who provide apprenticeships. There was also an opportunity for parents and students to attend a Apprenticeship workshop to increase their understanding. We were also grateful to be supported at the event by our Enterprise Advisor Harvey Bibby, who also presented to parents and offered his continuing support to Witchford Village College with employer engagement.

YEAR 11 DROP DOWN DAY—DECEMBER 2021

To continue to prepare students for the next steps after Witchford Village College we organised an off timetable day for Year 11 students. During this day students took part in activities such as an Apprenticeship Workshop with AIM Apprenticeships https://theaimgroup.co.uk/ for those that were interested. A virtual session on Finance with Natwest Bank speaking directly to students and being able to answer their questions on such topics as "What is a credit card?; Is it important to have a good credit rating?" . Also such topics as PAYE and having an improved idea of finance in general. This subject was really well received and students fed back that they felt it was useful to understand these topics that would help them throughout their lives.

A proportion of the day was also dedicated to MyChoice@16, making applications and reviewing courses that students wanted to apply to. Prospectus were available for all students to take away and look at in their own time and with their families. Students also have to complete a personal statement. Which is a piece of writing all about them as individuals, their aspirations, interests and achievements. Help was on hand from our English Department to ensure every student could produce a personal statement which reflected all of these qualities.

Students also took part in a Mental Health workshop talking about some of the stresses during exam time and working out strategies to overcome these. Information and advice was also available for students about who could approach if they felt that they had concerns and anxieties.

Witchford Village College welcomed Cambridge Regional College on the 23rd February 2022 for an event delivering a range of vocational subjects to Year 9 students. The tutors that came from CRC were all specialists in their field and the students were able to engage in subjects such as Engineering, Construction, Art, Computing, Sport & Uniformed Services and Care, Health & Early Years. The morning progressed really well with our students being able to consider some of the options that may be available for the future. We were also lucky enough that some of the present students from Cambridge Regional College, who were studying the subjects, were able to support and talk to students about life at CRC.










NATIONAL CAREERS WEEK 7TH- 11TH MARCH 2022



Witchford Village College celebrated this annual event by engaging with a variety of businesses and providers to ensure that students were aware of the many opportunities that they could think about after school.

We were grateful to Cambridge Regional College, Cambridge Commodities Ltd and Hill Group who all took the time to man pop up lunchtime stands. These are popular with students as they provide an informal way to talk to businesses and providers and are open to all students in the school and not targeted at one year group. Two of the companies representatives were also ex–students so making it even more interesting for students to talk through with them what they had achieved with their career since leaving Witchford Village College.

YEAR 10 CAREERS DROP DOWN DAY

Ensuring that students are able to access information about all routes and employment sectors is really important at Witchford Village College.

On the 11th March we were fortunate to be able to invite Vistry Group in to talk about the many different career paths in the construction industry. We heard from Planning, Site Management and

Sales to name a few.

One of the sessions during the day also focussed around

apprenticeships and CV Writing. Students spent time discussed what were good qualities to include in a CV and what impression an employer might gain from reading their CV. Apprenticeships were also discussed as a route, right up to Degree Level.

Careers in the Forces, particularly the RAF featured for students also during this day. A representative from the RAF spoke to students about different career paths within the services and what the
